#### Rider Ed

Well it is pretty much at the end of the riding season for the most part. If this is the time for you, to park your bike for a few months, then this is the time for you to be checking on all of your fluids in your bike. This would be brakes, clutch and the water in your battery. You will need to check the air in your tries. The best way to store your bike is on the center stand, this keeps all the oil in bottom of the engine. If you have a battery tender you should use it, it will keep your battery charged, if not you should charge your battery once a month for a few hours. If you are parking your bike for the winter or a few months you should put some fuel stabilizer in your fuel tank to keep the sensors clean and the moister out it also help to prevent varnishing. I hope these hints help you get through the winter. If you choose to ride this winter PLEASE watch out for black ice.


